Third Grade

David Coffin : **December 10**
**'Music from the King's Court ~ Exploring the
Early Winds'**

This engaging presentation covers the history of the recorder from the primitive ocarina through the medieval gemshorns and recorders of the Renaissance and Baroque periods. Mr. Coffin brings an extensive collection of recorders and other early wind instruments that he plays and shares with the students. The Discovery Museums : **January 6**
'Physical Changes of Matter'

Students will investigate the physical properties of solids, liquids, and gasses. Dry ice and liquid nitrogen make learning the five states of matter very dramatic. This highly interactive classroom presentation lets students shatter flowers and rubber balls, use bananas as hammers, and even shrink solid metal in seconds!

'Shocking Facts of Electricity'

Fifth Grade

Historical Perspectives: Ben Franklin April 8
A one-man theatrical show in which Ben Franklin comes to life and tells his story to fifth graders. Franklin delights audiences with his early days of mischievous adventure growing up in Colonial America. His quest for personal independence takes him to bustling Philadelphia where he becomes 'Ben Franklin, the Printer' and establishes the country's first lending library. Students will learn how his earlier years influenced his later greatness.

Techsplorations : 'Simple Machines' March 3
Using a twelve foot long lever, three foot tall gears and pulleys, a catapult, and a hand crank music machine; this program demonstrates how all simple machines help us do work by trading distance for effort. This is a whole new way to get students excited about simple machines.
